ORCID iD and CrossRef synchronisation

1) In the ORCID profile, scroll down to the Works section and use the “Add” instruction to make a selection via “**Search & link**”.

6) **After setting up the synchronisation, the [CrossRef Search and link](#) page**, which you can use it to add existing records to your ORCID profile, opens automatically.

- In the search box, enter your name or another **identifier that you use when publishing** – for example, ORCID iD.
